HYDEE FELDSTEIN SOTO SWEARING-IN CEREMONY

On Sunday, December 11th, 2022, I had the great pleasure of attending Hydee Feldstein Soto's swearing ceremony as the new City Attorney of Los Angeles. Despite the rain (and the last minute need to erect a massive tent for the event), the ceremony was well attended by many prominent City leaders, including Kristin Crowley, LA's first female Fire Chief of the LA Fire Department, who welcomed attendees. Also in attendance were outgoing City Attorney, Mike Feuer, Controller Ron Galperin, City Councilmembers Bob Blumenfield, Curren Price and John Lee, and LA City Councilmember, Monica Rodriguez, who administered the oath.

I had a chance to follow up on Hydee, who was born and raised in San Juan, Puerto Rico. She is proud of her background and her family's diverse culture. Her father, Stanley L. Feldstein, was a prominent Jewish lawyer who established his legal practice in Puerto Rico in the 1950s. Hydee recounted that he was a passionate lawyer who defended the rights of criminals in the late 1960s and early 1970s. Most importantly, he was responsible for the shutdown of the infamous La Princesa prison in San Juan – which was fraught with the government's egregious violence and human rights violations. Hydee added that she hopes to live the Jewish values her father had instilled in her: "justice, accountability, kindness and... healing and repairing the world." Her mother, Astrid Soto Feldstein, a 92-year-old, 3rd generation Puerto Rican Catholic, taught Hydee "to lead, as Latinas do, with heart first, with compassion, with faith and with spirit - not worrying about who gets the credit because the credit doesn't matter, but getting the job done and getting it done right – creating good for the greatest number of people." Initially, her parents were unable to find anyone to marry them because it was 1954 and there were laws that restricted intermarriage of any kind. Hydee's upbringing taught to her that equality and liberty are worth fighting for, which is something she vows to continue. According to her bio, she moved to the US when she was 17 years old to attend Swarthmore College and then Columbia University School of Law. After law school, she moved to Los Angeles and has been here ever since. She raised her family and built her career as a partner in private practice at a large international law firm.

I was happy to see that the Puerto Rican flag was on stage along with the U.S. and California flags. To honor her background, both a rabbi and a minister provided prayers. To close the event, Melissa Cha-Cha Figueroa of Yabucoa, Puerto Rico, sang the Puerto Rican National Anthem. She was one of the top finalists from Season 4 of American Idol. It was an honor for me to represent our NACOPRW SoCal chapter to witness this ceremony. We are very proud of Hydee and her great accomplishments and wish her great success in her new role as City Attorney of Los Angeles. She is an inspiration for all of us as Latina women.
